- Resulting from work-based learning
- Consisting of knowledge and practical unit standards

2. Learnerships

A learnership:

- Is an occupationally directed programme
- · Consist of both structured theoretical learning and practical workplace experience

A work-based education and training programme

· Is linked to a qualification registered on the national qualifications framework(NOF) with the south African qualifications authority (SAQA)

Benefits of learnerships?

For the learner

- They serve as an entrance into the sector for unemployed learners
- It increases employment opportunities
- There is a travel allowance for learners while they learn

For the employer

- Vehicle to address employment equity targets
- Provides skilled and experienced workers
- Improving productivity and quality
- Learnerships fast track the development of current employees

3. Skills Programme

A skills programme is:

- A shorter version of a learnership
- Occupationally based and constitutes credits towards a qualification registered on the NOF
- Meant to address short-term needs with a long-term benefit
- Intended to finally lead to a qualification.

4. Apprenticeships

The apprenticeship system:

- Is a technical training system
- Includes practical and theoretical components offered in listed trades to achieve artisanship status
- Includes a trade test in respect of that trade.

5. Recognition Of Prior Learning (Rpl)

RPL is a process:

- Whereby people are given a specific qualification recognition for the skills and knowledge they already have, which has not been formally recognized.
- Where assessment of such learning will be against nationally registered Unit Standards and/ or Qualifications
- Which assists with the elimination of the barriers to learning and assessment affecting the previously disadvantaged individuals.









DISCOVER YOUR

CAREER PATH

We spend more time in our lives at work than with our families. It stands to reason then, that we should do something that we are passionate about, something that makes us feel good at the end of each day. It takes time to reach those goals, in the meantime you would need to consider jobs that can help you reach your ultimate profession within the transport sector.

Ideally, you should consider getting assistance from a career coach who would help you complete a career assessment to identify your natural abilities, strengths, weaknesses and interests. From that information, a career coach would be able to guide you on how to reach a decision on which career path and field to follow.

If you do not have access to a career coach, you should take some time and get to know yourself to help identify the type of career you should follow.

Identify your strengths

- What is it that you are naturally good at?
- What is it that people always compliment you on or seek your advice on?

The points you are looking for here are things that come easily to you, for example "I am always the person someone can go to for help", "I am able to fix broken electronics", "I like to work with my hands and create new things."

Identify things that you struggle to do

• Things that take a lot of concentration or things that you would rather avoid.

What motivates you?

- Status Opportunity to grow into a management position or a role of authority
- Image A position that others admire
- Service Playing a supportive or caring role in the lives of others
- Money Opportunities that pay well
- Interest To work with something that has a definite interest to you

How do you prefer to work?

- Do you prefer to work on your own, work in a group?
- Do multiple tasks or focus on one thing at a time?

Do you prefer:

- · Working with people
- · Technical, Science, Arts or Practical
- Working with Words. Information or Data

Take some time to really think about your future, where you want to live, what you would do if money was no object, what type of people or things would you like to work with and what makes you excited. Take all of these notes and start narrowing down the information into keywords, using the keyword groups start identifying possible career options and research them to understand if they are suited to your unique personality. In the next chapters (4-12) we have included two sections for each career to help you match your attributes.

HOW TO EDUCATE YOURSELF ACCORDING TO YOUR DESIRED CAREER PATH

Once you have decided on a career path, you need to understand what tertiary qualifications you would need to assist you in securing employment in your chosen field, you can do this by researching the job and identifying the different qualifications that are in demand for that specific role. South Africa has many options when it comes to studying further, you can consider any of the following:

- · Long distance study or self-study
- Public TVET College
- · Private College
- University
- University of Technology

Funding your education can come in different forms, you would need to take the time to research and see which options would be best suited to your needs. You can also discuss the options with any of the institutions that you want to study through.

Bursaries

If you have worked hard in high school and achieved minimum results required for bursaries, you can submit your applications. Bursary providers offer different amounts and may focus on specific professions. In return for this, companies may require you to sign a contract to work for them for a set period either while studying or after you have completed your studies.

TETA awards bursaries every year for qualifying students to study transport related qualifications at South African institutions. Be constantly on the lookout for advertisement on the TETA website and social media platforms.

Scholarship

A scholarship is generally awarded to students who have excellent academic achievements.

Generally, there is no requirement for working back or repaying the company for scholarships.

Student Loans

There are various financial institutions that offer loans to students. These loans accumulate interests and must be paid back in full

Financial Aid

Most larger universities offer financial aid to students who have excelled in their academic results. Each university would have its own criteria for a student to qualify for financial aid. To understand this criteria, you would need to contact the university's financial aid office



National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS)

NSFAS supports access to, and success in. higher education and training for students from poor and working-class families who would otherwise not be able to afford to study. The NSFAS identifies eligible students, provides loans and bursaries to qualifying students.

NSFAS student loans are income-contingent, which means that repayment commences when you start working. Repayments of your student loan are based on the salary that you earn and start once your salary exceeds a certain threshold per year. In 2018, the South African government began a roll out phase for free higher education for first year students. For more information, please contact the Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET).

Work While Studying

Earning while you study is an option for you to take control of the payment or repayment for your studies, this option generally works best for students that are self-motivated and extremely focused on their goals. You would need to learn to manage your time efficiently to be able to succeed in financing your studies on your own, most often sacrificing social interactions to dedicate the time to achieving your goals.

Create a job search plan

After reading through from chapters 4 to 12 in this guide, you will have an idea on the career path you want to follow and how to attain education for specific careers. It is important to note that finding a job requires a job search plan.











- You will need to choose a career that
 is going to take you to the position you
 envisage yourself in, as you would not be
 starting in that position but rather growing
 into it.
- Start by identifying the skills you would need to be able to effectively fulfill the role you want to move into. Those skills can be broken up into the following categories:
 - Soft Skills are personality orientated skills, these are characteristics you have or have grown, how you interact and relate to people. These skills can include communication, listening, patience, problem solving, leadership, etc;
 - Hard Skills are more quantifiable and normally learnt and applied in the workplace, these can include typing, machine operation, an additional language, sales skills, etc; and
 - Technical Skills these are generally associated with your ability to use machinery, equipment, computer programmes and IT related systems.

Once you have identified the skills you would need for the job,

- You can start identifying entry level positions that would assist you in growing your skills.
- Identify the type of job you will be applying for, what companies could offer these types of roles and how long you intend

- on staying in that position before moving into the next phase of employment.
- In addition to identifying potential jobs, you can also now pinpoint additional educational needs to help you reach your goals.

How to create a CV relevant to the South African market?

It is easy to jump onto the Internet and search for a modernised CV that can help you market yourself to potential employers. However, templates provided don't always contain information specific to the South African job market. It is vital that you conduct sufficient research to understand what is required when submitting your application for a position. Your CV is a reflection of you, it is the very first impression that you will be providing a potential employer, ensure that:

- The font used is easy to read
- Everything is typed in sentence case, never use capital letters throughout the document
- · Headings are highlighted
- The formatting of the CV is aligned
- Ensure you have completed a spell check and that all contact information is correct
- If you include a photo, ensure it is a professional looking photo taken in front of a blank setting where you are dressed as you would when going to work.



A good CV should contain the following information:

Personal summary

- Your personal summary is a brief overview that will give your employer a glimpse into who you are,
- · What you do, relevant skills for the position you are applying for and finally what your current career goals are.
- It is important to keep the information brief and to the point as recruiters and hiring managers receive hundreds of applications and you don't want them skipping over the summary because it is too much to read.

Personal details

Include only relevant personal details to your CV, avoid interests and hobbies unless they are specific to the career path you have chosen.

Information within this section should generally be kept to the following:

- Nationality
- Date of birth do not include your ID number as it is a potential risk
- · Residential area you do not need to include your full address
- Cellphone number ensure that you include an alternative number in the event the recruiter cannot contact you on the number provided

- Email address your email address should be professional, ideally your name and surname or variations thereof
- What languages you speak
- Availability/notice period how soon you would be able to start working.

Educational details

- · When moving into the job market you should provide the recruiter or hiring manager with as much information as possible, including subjects taken.
- This section should include qualifications you have completed and the year they were completed
- The qualifications that are still in progress, which institution you are completing them through and the year you aim to have them completed in.















Skills

The skills that you include in this area:

- Would be those you have identified earlier,
- They must be honest and ideally rated to provide the reader with an understanding of your ability.
- If you have just started using Microsoft Office, advise that you are a beginner.
- Be realistic, don't just add anything in here to get the job.
- You can use the job advertisement to source skills that are required by the company,
- They must be skills you possess as you will be expected to perform based on the information you have supplied.

You can expand on these skills to "back up your statement" for example if you include communication skills, expand them to include where you have used your written, verbal and listening skills.

Achievements

Include significant achievements that will show traits such as:

- Leadership potential
- Event management
- Social responsibility

The information for this should provide:

- · What the achievement is for,
- Who gave you the recognition and
- In what year it was achieved.

Volunteering

Volunteering is a great way to add experience to your CV, include:

- · Who you volunteered for,
- What your duties were,
- For what period you were actively involved.

This could also be a great source of a reference to include in your CV.

Experience

For your experience:

- Must be listed from your most recent position to your first job
- If you do not have any experience, then this section will be excluded from your CV
- Do not make up information to "fill" the CV
- Remember employers can very quickly check to ensure that the information supplied is factual

Your experience should include:

- · Company name
- Your job title
- The month and year you started
- · The month and year your left
- All duties while employed in the position, listed in bullet point format
- Any significant achievements
- Reasons for leaving



References

Before adding someone as a reference to your CV:

- · Request permission from them
- They should ideally be someone that you have worked for or worked with
- You would need to include up to three references
- But if you do not have any, rather do not list them.

Information listed for each reference would need to include:

- Which company they are a reference for
- Their full names
- What their job title at the time was
- Their cellphone number or office number
- Email address

Supporting documents

Scan all documents that could be required by an employer in colour so that you can save them electronically and ensure that the size of the documents is not too big for emailing.

These can include:

- Qualifications and transcripts
- Learners/driver's license
- ID
- Written references

HOW TO APPLY FOR JOBS

The most commonly used application method in South Africa is to apply via email; therefore, you as the job-seeker should ensure that you are able to submit your application to recruiters and hiring managers in this format. If you do not have an email address, there are free services such as Gmail, vahoo and webmail where you can create a free account.

The majority of jobs are advertised on the Internet.

- These jobs can be found on company websites, recruiter websites Job portals and job aggregators.
- Generally, to apply via these platforms you would need to create an account, input information required and upload your CV and then apply for jobs that are within your field of interest.

It is important when applying for a job to ensure:

- You meet a minimum of 80% of the job requirements
- The 20% that you don't meet should not be minimum considerations or part of a core function
- Read through the job specification completely, to understand the exact requirements of the role and the application process required
- Most adverts include how to apply, what documents to send and possibly a













- reference that should be included send only what is requested
- If no information is supplied, send only your CV, using the advertised job title as the subject line in your email.
- In the body of the email provide a very brief description of your suitability for the position and ensure that you attach your most current CV in either a Microsoft Word or PDF format

Should you have not heard from the recruiter/ hiring manager after 3 - 5 working days, send a follow up email to find out if you have been shortlisted for the position or ask if they require any additional information.

The Interview Process

Once you have been shortlisted, the recruiter or hiring manager will contact you to attend an interview. You would require the following information to ensure that you are ready to attend the interview:

- Who you will be meeting with
- What their role is within the company
- Where the company is based
- The full job specs
- If they require you to take any documents with you

Preparing for the interview

- Get to know the company by reviewing their website and
- Understanding exactly what it is they do
- What their goals are and if it is in line with your job search plan

- Choose a professional, comfortable outfit for the interview
- Make sure it is clean and ready for the day, you should be presenting a polished version of yourself
- Make sure that you go through the job spec and research potential questions that could be asked by the interviewer
- Practice answering these questions with a family member to help you prepare
- Ensure that you know where you are going and
- Plan your trip to arrive at least 30 minutes earlier than the interview is scheduled
- You never want to be late for an interview
- Prepare questions for the interviewer about things that are important to you
- Research them and make sure when you ask them, you are not asking something that has already been covered in the job spec or on the company website.

The Interview

It is natural to be nervous going into an interview:

- Remain calm
- Extend a firm handshake and remember to maintain eye-contact.
- Try to keep your composure if you need to take a few seconds to breathe and think about your answer that is ok\
- Questions to graduates will generally not be about previous experience
- But rather about your personality, achievements, how you would approach certain tasks and your future goals



- Pay close attention to the question being asked, answer it clearly and
- Don't get caught up talking about something that is not relevant to the question
- Should a question be asked that you are not prepared for, don't panic
- Take a sip of your water and give yourself a few seconds to process an answer
- Be clear and if you are not sure what you would do, say so and
- That you would seek guidance from management on functions, situations or events that you are not clear on.

At the end of the interview, you should ask questions that you have prepared. If they have already been answered during the course of the interview, then do not repeat the questions. This is also a time to seek clarity on anything that has come up during the interview that you are unsure of.

- A day or two before that, send a follow up mail to advise them of your keen interest in the position and how you are looking forward to receiving the final decision from them
- In the event that you are not successful after an interview. mail the interviewer and thank them for the feedback and
- Ask if they could provide you with details as to what you could do better, in their view, to improve your interview skills.

FOLLOW UP

- After the interview, send an email to the interviewer thanking them for taking the time to meet with you
- · Reiterate your interest in the role and provide them with the option to contact you for any information that they may still need
- Generally, during the interview, you will be advised about when they are planning on making a final decision for the appointment of the role

Occupational Code: 214403

Brief Job Description

- Responsible for the design, development, modification and maintenance of the components and systems of all types of flight vehicles (aircraft, helicopters, missiles and so on)
- Must be technical savvy

Entry Requirements

- · Grade 12 with Mathematics. Science and English
- Degree in Aeronautical Engineering

Required Qualities for Success

- · Strong mathematical, analytical and problem-solving skills
- · Technical expertise
- · Creativity and innovative thinking
- Attention to detail

Factors to Consider

- · Requires strict adherence to safety regulations
- · May face high pressure environments and tight deadlines
- Requires a commitment to keeping up to date with technical developments

AIRCRAFT TECHNICIAN

Brief Job Description

- · Repair and perform scheduled maintenance on aircraft
- There are different areas of specialisation as listed below

Areas you can specialise in

- Aircraft assembler develops, designs all aircraft/air vehicles
- Aircraft electrician maintains, inspects, repairs, overhaul and test aircraft electrical components.
- Aircraft electroplater (712201) works with electrochemical processes to plat aircraft parts for reconstruction or to prevent corrosion..
- Aircraft instrument mechanic (672101) installs, repairs and tests navigation and flying equipment
- Aircraft mechanic (653201) responsible for the maintenance of aircraft components like engine, fuel systems, hydraulic and pneumatic components, landing gears, brakes, pumps, and many more.
- Aircraft painter (643202) responsible for the protective and decorative finishing of the aircraft body, its engine and components.
- Aircraft radartrician (672104) -maintains all communication equipment of the aircraft













- Aircraft structures (653202) responsible for the manufacture, maintenance, repair and modification of air craft structures and components
- Aircraft trimmer (653202) responsible for the manufacture, maintenance, repair and modification of interior components like survival equipment, seat covers, fabric panels, insulation, carpets and curtains.

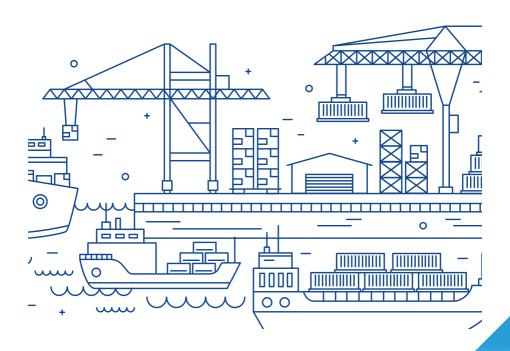

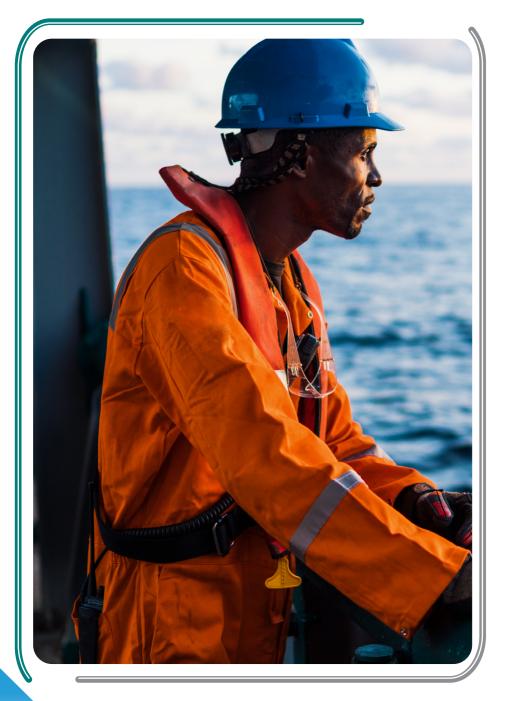

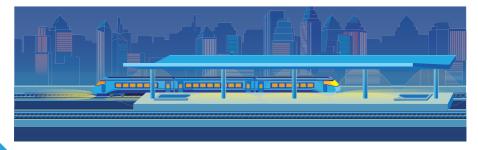

- Has self determination to overcome obstacles no matter the circumstances present.
- Can hang on to a task until desired results are achieved
- Can draw lessons from failure than give

TYPES OF BUSINESSES YOU CAN **ESTABLISH**

Sole proprietor

- · One-man-show business
- · Trade under vour own name
- You are responsible for everything the business does
- It does not have many requirements
- You are personally liable for any debts that the business accumulates

Partnership

- Typically established by accountants, lawyers, doctors, etc.
- They share expertise to service the market

- Comprise two or more people and
- Any profits, losses and debts incurred by business are shared amongst partners.

Private Company

- Owned by at least one shareholder who contribute capital to start the business
- Shareholders appoint directors to manage the affairs of the company
- Is treated as a legal person and is entirely separate from the shareholders.
- Less risky than sole proprietor

Franchise

- There are royalties to be paid for using the franchising company branding
- It is easy to establish but Requires a large sum of money to obtain the licence
- You cannot divert from the policies set by the franchising company

Steps Required to Start Your Own **Business**

- Assess your passions in life and establish if there can be a business opportunity around them. Starting a business in the field that you like is a sure foundation to perseverance and success.
- · Identify the area you would like to operate in (Do your own thorough market research).
- · Decide on what business skills you would require in managing the new venture.
- Decide the type or legal structure you would prefer.

- Once registered open a bank account for the business.
- Register your business venture with SARS for tax purposes.
- Obtain also a BBBEE certificate from accredited agencies.

- Obtain other required licences to operate your business.
- Draw up a business plan that you can use to acquire finance and manage your operations.
